Although Canberra is the capital city, Sydney is the oldest, largest the most modern and probably the most beautiful city. The Sydney 25) _____ is one of the best known landmarks in Australia. The second biggest city of Australia is Melbourne. Melbourne is well known in Australia for its crazy climate (4 seasons in one day!).
