- a shop where you can buy cigarettes etc.

- a shop where you can buy paper goods.

optician's – _____

- a shop where you can buy glasses / contact lenses.

clothes shop – _____

- a shop where you can buy clothes.

shoe shop – _____

- a shop where you can buy shoes.

hardware shop / hardware store /ironmonger – _____

- a shop where you can buy hard goods, such as nails and screws.

corner shop – _____

- a shop on the corner of your street, selling a range of basic goods - food, newspapers, sweets, bread, etc.

deli - _____

- a shop where you can buy special food not normally found in supermarkets.

bookshop /bookstore - _____

- a shop where you can buy books.

pet shop - _____

- a shop where you can buy an animal such as rabbit, hamster, etc. or pet food.

toy shop – _____

- a shop where you can buy toys.

flea market – _____

- a group of stalls selling old furniture or clothes.

petrol station (UK) /gas station (US) – _____

- sells petrol, car products and sometimes food.
