### Are you planning a trip to London?

‘Go shopping in the markets of London’, advises travel writer Thomas Robson.

In the age of huge supermarkets and Internet shopping, it`s easy to forget the fun of shopping in real places with real people. This week, I wandered around London`s markets. At the end of a busy week I decided – I`m going to stop going to the supermarket. I`m going to use local shops and markets and I`m going to use the Internet less. Let me explain why.

In markets you`ll find all kinds of bargains and original things to buy. Another advantage of going to the markets is that it`s a great excuse to walk around the city instead of hiding away on the tube or going around on tour buses and missing all the real sights.

Some of the markets in London are so old they`re part of the city history. Borough market is the oldest and dates back to medieval times. Of course it`s changed a lot since then and now sells organic fruits and vegetables.

If it's food you're after, you'll find the best seafood at Billingsgate market and the best meat at Smithfield's. But, if it's variety you're looking for, try Camden Town.

Camden Town in North London is one of London's top attractions, especially for young people. It's full of colorful markets, shops, restaurants, bars, pubs, clubs, theatres and cinemas. The markets have always been at the centre of the alternative fashion scene and many new fashion designers sell their clothes there. But you can buy almost anything in the markets: music, antiques, art and of course, all kinds of food and drink. Parts of the markets are open every day, but it's the weekend that's most exciting.

If you want something a bit slicker, go to Covent Garden. This used to be an old fruit and vegetable market but today it's a pizza with boutiques, cafés, restaurants and pubs. Covent Garden is famous for its street entertainment such as jugglers, clowns and mime artists. It's also close to lots of other attractions such as the London Transport Museum and The Royal Opera House. Theatre land is nearby too, so after a great shopping trip you can relax at an Andrew Lloyd Webber musical!

Another market to visit is Portobello in Notting Hill. Is ultra fashionable and full of young people and you'll find plenty of really original things from antiques to designer clothes. Notting Hill is expensive, but if you don't want to spend money, you can spend time hanging out, looking at the people and the amazing houses. You can also walk to Kensington and visit London's most famous department store, Harrods. It's quite a bit different from the markets!
