CHARLES DICKENS (1812 - 1870)

Charles Dickens was an English novelist who came from a big family. He had seven brothers and sisters. His parents were poor. Charles' father owed some money and when Charles was 12 years old, his father and the rest of the family had to go to prison because of his father's debts.

Young Charles was the only one from the family who could earn money at that time. He had to leave school and went to work 10 hours a day at a boot-blackening factory. The factory was dirty and full of rats and Charles disliked working there. Later when Charles Dickens became a writer he wrote about little boys working at factories in horrible conditions.

After some time Charles' father inherited some money from a relative and he and the whole family were released from prison. Charles started going to school again, but it wasn't a very good school. The teachers and especially the headmaster were very strict and the level of education was low. Charles' memories from the school were later used in *David Copperfield*.

When Charles gave up his studies, he started to work at a law office and later as a reporter for newspapers and magazines. Readers liked his articles and he started to be more and more successful.

He married Catherine Hogarth and together they had 10 children, but in 1858 they separated. In the 1840s he became so popular that people recognized him in the streets - he was a real celebrity of that time.

In 1865, he was in a train accident and never fully recovered. He died in 1870 at his home in Kent. He is buried in Poet's Corner at Westminster Abbey in London.
