Question tags

Definition

Question tags are short questions used at the end of a sentence. We form a question tag with an auxiliary verb (be/do/have/can) and a pronoun (I, you, he, we).

- I'm late, aren't I?
- Tom is handsome, isn't he?
- Your sister can't speak French, can she?

1. We usually use a negative question tag after affirmative sentences.

Affirmative sentence  negative question tag

He likes playing tennis, doesn't he?

We were late, weren't we?

You are right, aren't you?

They have got a car, haven't they?

2. We usually use a positive question tag after negative sentences.

Negative sentence  positive question tag

I'm not tired, aren't I?

He hasn't got a cat, has he?

She wasn't home yesterday, was she?

They didn't go to the restaurant, did they?

- In question tags we can use **there** as a subject, instead of a pronoun.

There's some cheese in the fridge, isn't there?

- In sentences with **Let's**, the question tag is **shall we?**

Let's go to the shopping mall, shall we?

- In imperative sentences, the question tag is **will you?**

Turn off the light, will you?

- We use aren't I (not am I not) in question tags

I'm late, aren't I?
