Education in Britain is 17)_____, and most children go to 18)_____ schools. Some parents pay to send their children to independent schools which are in England and Wales called 19)_____, although they are not really public at all! Many of these are boarding schools, where children live and sleep during the term.

All children and young people between the ages of 5 and 16 must get full time education. Pupils are allowed to concentrate gradually on those subjects they are interested in. People are usually grouped according to their ability.

At the age of 16 pupils take 20) _____ (General Certificate of Secondary Education) and after passing it they attend the school for 2 more years. At 18, they can take A levels (usually in two or three subjects) and who successfully pass it can start to study at the university or college.

Students who want to leave school at 16, sit for the Certificate of Secondary Education.

English students are evaluated by marks A to E. A is the best and E is the worst.
